

3rd Platoon, Echo 2/1 Patrolling Quang Nam Province




Cpl Clinton Davis Rifle Squad Leader 3rd Platoon E 2/1




Echo 2/1 Patrol 10-15 meters tactical separation

Col. Jim Bathurst Pre-Vietnam Marine Barracks, Yokosuka, Japan



"It was the duty station that changed me from counting the days till my hitch was up to wanting to reenlist for six more. Marine Barracks, Yokosuka, Japan, from October 1959–October 1961.

Started out in the Security section as an MP and made it to the Main Gate team, then was transferred to the Brig section where I made LCpl and meritorious Cpl. Had I not gone there I would have gotten out.

I FINALLY was under the charge of some "real" NCOs, and met two outstanding GySgts, the Guard Chief, GySgt JC (Jesus Christ) Laplace and the Brig Warden GySgt Alton A Cobb. Even after all these years I look back on those two as having a real influence on me as a Marine. From then on, all I ever wanted to be was a GySgt of Marines.

And yes, in the photo to the right, that is the green jacket. We had a green blouse (Winter Service A) and a green jacket (Winter Service B). It had a variety of nicknames, e.g., Ike Jacket, but us Marines called it the Battle Jacket. Don't ask why it got that name but that's what we called it. This uniform was not unique to Yokosuka, it was Corps-wide.



Sgt Jim Bathurst, Platoon Sergeant, Echo 2/1, Quang Tri Province, Vietnam




Capt Jim Bathurst, commanding the Marine Corps Drill Team, 8th & I, Washington, D.C.

Jim was awarded the Silver Star, Bronze Star, Purple Heart, and a battlefield commission to 2nd Lieutenant. Jim went on to command the Marine Corps Drill Team in Washington D.C. and retired as a full bird Colonel.
